What is SEND?

SEND means **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities**. Children with SEND may need extra help with learning, communication, or physical needs.

- **Support Staff:**

What Needs Do We Support?

We help with:

- Dyslexia
- Autism (ASD)
- Speech and language difficulties

- Learning delays
- Physical disabilities
- Emotional and mental health needs

How We Help

We follow the **Assess** → **Plan** → **Do** → **Review** cycle:

1. **Assess** - Understand your child's needs
2. **Plan** - Create a support plan
3. **Do** - Provide help and interventions
4. **Review** - Check progress and update plans

Support may include:

- Individual Education Plans (IEPs)
- Small group sessions
- Classroom adjustments
- Specialist advice

Working Together

We involve:

- Parents and carers
- Pupils
- Outside experts (e.g., therapists, doctors)

Wellbeing Matters

We support mental health through:

- Inclusive teaching
- Trained Emotional Literacy Support Assistants (ELSA)
- Access to services like Healthy Minds and School Nursing

Reviews and Progress

- Reviews happen at least **three times a year**
- Parents are invited to meetings
- If progress is strong, children may be removed from the SEND register
- If more help is needed, we seek further support or apply for an EHCP
