



## Key Vocabulary

<b>wild</b>	living or growing in the natural environment
<b>common</b>	found often
<b>flower</b>	part of plant that makes the seed
<b>weeds</b>	an unwanted wild plant
<b>stem</b>	holds up the plant
<b>root</b>	part of the plant that attaches underground
<b>seed/bulb</b>	the small part of a plant that grows into a new plant
<b>leaves</b>	part of a plant that grows from the branches or stem
<b>petals</b>	coloured part of a flower
<b>mature</b>	fully grown
<b>soil</b>	the top layer of the earth's surface dirt and mud
<b>germination</b>	when a plant starts to grow
